Comentario del 6.º domingo del Tiempo ordinario (Ciclo A). “Vete primero a reconciliarte con tu hermano, y vuelve después para presentar tu ofrenda”. Dios nos espera en cada Misa. Agradecemos su llamada contagiando la paz y la alegría a nuestro alrededor.

El pasaje de este domingo forma parte del primero de esos discursos, el Sermón de la Montaña, y consiste en un fragmento de las llamadas “antítesis”. La atractiva novedad que predica el Maestro no cae en el fácil tópico de la trasgresión de la norma establecida o de su abolición: “no he venido a abolir la Ley y los Profetas sino a darles plenitud”. Para ser ciudadanos del Reino de los cielos, Jesús propone lo de siempre, pero de una forma nueva, plena y perfecta: la que Él mismo encarna. Y la ley del amor que Jesús inaugura exige plenitud hasta en lo más pequeño.

Con motivo del precepto sobre el adulterio (cfr. Ex 20,14; Dt 5,18), Jesús vuelve a subrayar desde otro punto de vista el exelso respeto hacia los demás que subyace en la Ley. Si el adulterio consiste en adueñarse por satisfacción personal de una persona casada, esto no debe hacerse ni siquiera en el fuero interno, donde se comete el mismo pecado, aunque no se realice externamente: “ha cometido adulterio en su corazón” (v. 28).

También Jesús enseña acerca de la ley mosaica sobre los juramentos (cfr. Lv 19,12; Nm 30,3; Dt 23,22), la cual busca evitar la mentira y el engaño. Estos se producían más fácilmente si al hacerlos se invocababa a Dios o a algo muy valioso; por eso eran más graves. Jesús resuelve toda casuística y juramento grandilocuente exigiendo sencillez y honestidad: “que vuestro modo de hablar sea ‘Sí, sí’; ‘No, no’. Lo demás ‘viene del maligno’ (V. 37), quizás porque la necesidad de subrayar más la palabra dada es un inicio de sospecha.
