The Most Reverend David J. Bonnar is the sixth Bishop of the Diocese of Youngstown, appointed by Pope Francis in November 2020 and installed in January 2021. A native of Pittsburgh, Bishop Bonnar was ordained a priest in 1988 after seminary studies in Rome, where he earned a degree in Sacred Theology from the Pontifical Gregorian University.

Throughout nearly four decades of priestly ministry, Bishop Bonnar has served the Church with great dedication as a parish priest, seminary rector, Director of Vocations, and Episcopal Vicar for Clergy. He has also been deeply involved in the formation and support of priests and deacons and is well known for his pastoral leadership and love for parish life. In addition, he has served the wider Church as editor of The Priest magazine and as a member of the USCCB National Advisory Board. For twelve years he was also chaplain to the Pittsburgh Steelers.

We are blessed to welcome Bishop David J. Bonnar as the preacher for our Lenten Mission, and we look forward to the wisdom, faith, and pastoral heart he will share with us during these grace-filled days.

Durante la Cuaresma, la Iglesia Católica nos pide practicar tres acciones fundamentales, conocidas como los “tres pilares” o prácticas cuaresmales, destinadas a la conversión y preparación para la Pascua:

- **Oración:** Aumentar el diálogo con Dios, la reflexión y la lectura de la Biblia.
- **Ayuno:** Un sacrificio voluntario que implica auto-control, renuncia (física o de hábitos) y penitencia.
- **Limosna (Caridad):** Compartir nuestros bienes y tiempo con los necesitados, practicando la generosidad. Estas prácticas, basadas en el evangelio de Mateo (Mt 6, 1-18), buscan reorientar el corazón hacia Dios. EWTN Global Catholic Television Network

Durante la cuaresma la Iglesia sugiere que ofrezcamos algo, que hagamos algún sacrificio, AYUNO, Renuncia. Cuando elegimos renunciar a algo entrenamos el corazón para que sea más grande, más libre, más capaz de amar. No eliminamos los deseos, los orientamos hacia lo que de verdad importa.

Pensándolo bien, el sacrificio no ha pasado de moda. De hecho, sigue estando en todas partes: en quien entrena cuando no le apetece, en quien se calla para no herir, en quien elige lo mejor en lugar de lo más fácil.

La diferencia está en el porqué.

Porque el sacrificio, en el fondo, no es complicarse la vida, sino hacerla más grande.

La palabra lo dice todo: sacrificio viene de sacrum facere, es decir, “hacer sagradas las cosas”. Darles valor, ofrecerlas, entregarlas por amor a Dios y a los demás. No se trata de perder, sino de convertir lo pequeño —un gesto, una renuncia, un detalle— en algo lleno de sentido.

Y ahí la mortificación, el sacrificio, empieza a sonar a libertad. A elegir, conscientemente, no dejarse llevar por todo lo que nos gusta más, para querer mejor.

La Cuaresma es precisamente ese tiempo. No un paréntesis triste, sino una invitación a caminar con Jesús, a acompañarle en ese camino hacia la Semana Santa donde el amor se mide en entrega. Un tiempo para redescubrir que, cuando el sacrificio es por amor se vuelve profundamente actual.
